- Changing perspectives in the study of telework, cowork, and other forms of remote work.
- Successful stories in the effective use of information technology to thrive during telework.
- New trends in the concept of coworking spaces (CWS), motivations and outcomes of working from CWS.

The track is approached from a double perspective: research and business practice. The studies presented in this track will expand the knowledge on remote forms of work and will serve as catalysts to innovation in the managerial space. The debate amongst speakers and facilitators will be facilitated by means of sparking innovation in the areas of study.
